

Thanks to generous benefactors like John Rosatti who stepped-up to support The Benjamin School's Campaign for Tomorrow, the preeminent college preparatory school was able to open its doors nearly four years ago to 463 students and faculty in a newly constructed state-of-the-art campus in Palm Beach Gardens, Florida.

In 2002, Mr. Rosatti made a \$1,000,000 pledge to fund the Rosatti Administrative and Library/Media Center which is one of the premier facilities on the school's Upper School Campus. The 17,290 square foot facility is named in honor of Mr. Rosatti's late wife, Bonni. The couple's three children, - Adam, Angela, and Crystal are students of the school and all attend classes on the Upper School Campus.

The various components of the Rosatti Center have their own unique benefit to the school. These include a library and media center, the student services center, the college counseling department, the technology department and administrative and support staff offices and conference rooms.

The student support services are now housed all under one roof and include a student health clinic, student service director's office and the student services lobby and conference room. These facilities enhance the school's student life programs.

In keeping with the school's mission to be a college preparatory school, the school's college counseling program provides services and programming to all Upper School students. The college counseling facilities are housed in the Rosatti Center and these facilities are used by over 200 students each year as they engage in varying stages of the college counseling process. These facilities include individual offices for the Dean, Assistant Dean, and Secretary of College Counseling and the college counseling suite where students can meet in groups to discuss various aspects of college counseling.

The administration of the school also greatly benefits from this wonderful facility. Housed in the Rosatti Center are offices for the Head of School, Upper School Head, Dean of Students, and Academic Dean. Other offices include two separate offices for both Admissions and Development.

The technology facilities housed in the Rosatti Center include office space for the school's Director of Technology and also two full-time staff members. In addition, the Technology offices house the school's central server and a work space for facilitating the Upper School laptop program that benefits all 463 Upper School students, faculty, and staff.

Since the campus' opening in the fall of 2004, the library media center has enabled the school to provide numerous expanded resources for students and faculty with its new facilities: two study rooms and a conference room for small group learning sessions, a video production studio, a media classroom and separate editing room, table seating for 50 students, a reading lounge area with newspaper and magazine shelving, computer work stations, and 5000 sq. ft. of shelf space to accommodate the schools enlarged collection of 12,000 books and reference materials. The library also serves as the central

data hub for the campus' computer, telephone and television systems.
